

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear People of God,

Good morning to all. Again, I specially thank all those who decorated the Cribs and Churches in all our three parishes. I also sincerely thank you all who participated in Christmas Masses. I was very happy to see more people.

Today, we solemnly celebrate the feast of "The Epiphany of the Lord," and this is the last Sunday of the Christmas season. Now, the word "Epiphany" comes from the Greek word 'Epiphania' meaning 'revelation,' or 'manifestati on.'

According to the tradition, "The Epiphany of the Lord" signifies - specifically the manifestation of the Christ child to the entire world. Now, the feast of "The Epiphany of the Lord," tells us that Jesus came not only for the Jews but also for the Gentiles. Paul states this very clearly in the Second Reading of today in his letter to the Ephesians, "...in Christ Jesus, the Gentiles are now co-heirs with the Jews, members of the same body, and sharers of the same promise through the preaching of the Gospel." In other words, God wants everyone to be saved and come to the knowledge of the Truth.


KNIGHT OF COLUMBUS


