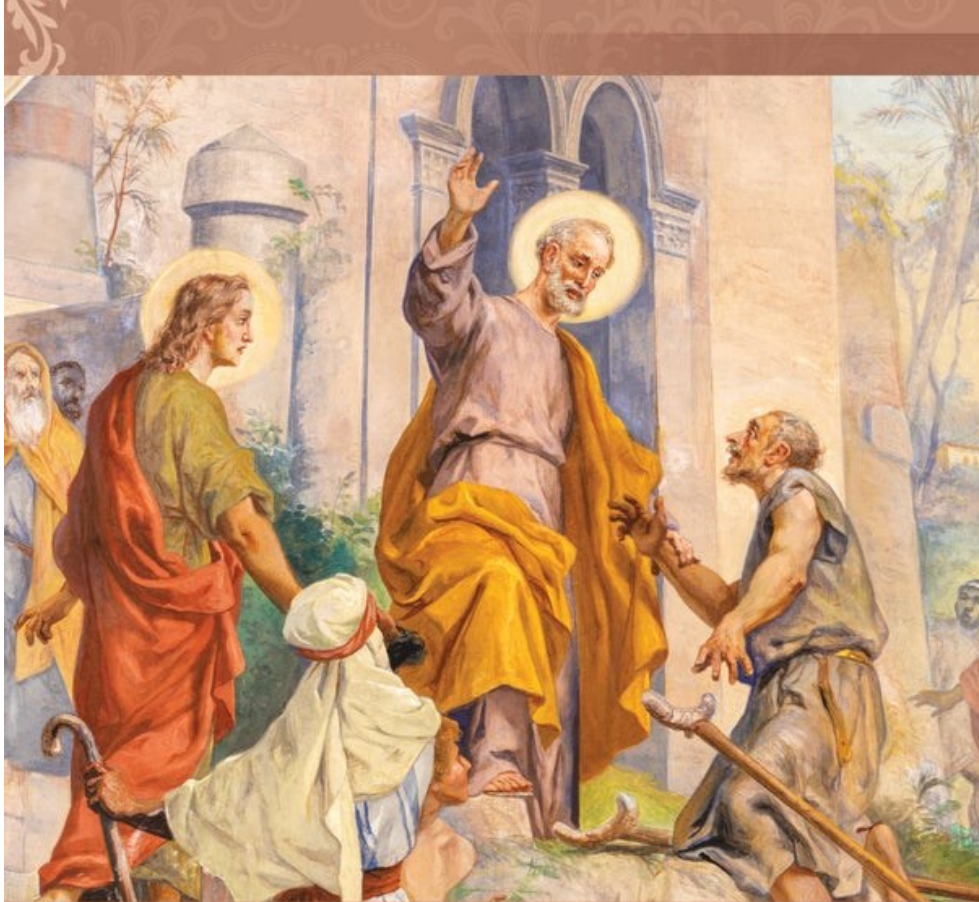

## FROM OUR PASTOR

In today's Gospel, we are given a remarkable glimpse into the hearts of Jesus. Before He teaches, before He heals, before He sends out His disciples, Matthew tells us something profoundly important: Jesus sees the crowds and is moved with compassion. He looks upon the people and sees more than faces in a crowd. He sees their struggles, fears, wounds, disappointments and spiritual hunger. Matthew describes them as "troubled and abandoned, like a sheep without a shepherd." They were searching for meaning, guidance, hope and healing.

Many are surrounded by technology yet feel lonely. Many are materially comfortable yet spiritually restless. Many carry hidden burdens - anxiety, grief, family difficulties, financial worries, addiction, guilt, or uncertainty about the future. Behind smiles and outward appearances, countless people are longing for someone to show them the way to God. Jesus still sees them . and just as He was moved with compassion.

The first lesson of this Gospel is that God's response to human suffering is not indifference but compassion. The compassion of Jesus is not mere sympathy. It is love that acts. His heart is moved and therefore He teaches, heals, forgives and saves. Jesus then says something surprising: "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few." He does not say the field is barren. He does not say people are uninterested in God. He does not say there is no hope. Instead, He says the harvest is abundant.

God is at work in human hearts. There are people

searching for truth. There are people ready to receive hope. There are people longing to hear that they are loved and forgiven by God. The problem is not the harvest. The problem is the shortage of laborers. The world needs witnesses. It needs disciples willing to bring Christ into homes, workplaces, schools, communities and families.

Too often Christians assume that evangelization belongs only to priests, religious, missionaries or church leaders. But Jesus calls every baptized believer to participate in His mission. not everyone is called to preach from a pulpit but everyone is called to bear witness. a kind word, a prayer with someone who is suffering, an act of forgiveness, a life of integrity, a testimony of faith, these can become powerful instruments of God's grace.

Before Jesus sends the disciples, He first tells them to pray: "Ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers." Prayer comes before mission. This is a lesson we often forget. we rush into activity without first seeking God's guidance. The Church needs Holy priests, religious sisters and brothers, missionaries, catechists and faithful lay leaders. but vocations are born through prayer.

The world still contains many people who are weary, confused and searching for meaning. The harvest remains abundant. may we not stand on the sidelines. may we become laborers in the Lord's field, carrying His mercy, truth and love wherever we go.
